Ordinance No. Series 1909 An Ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 56, Series 1887, "entitled an Ordinance to license and regulate certain callings and employ-

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 6 of Or-Hance No. 56 Series 1887, be, and the same hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section. That any person wishing to open up or keep a bowling alley. shooting gallery, billiard room or pool room shall pay a license according to the number of alleys, galleries, billiand or pool tables belonging to or used in the building or place to be licensed, as follows: for one alley. gallery, billiard or pool table, the apdicant shall pay a half yearly liceuse of Fifteen Dollars, and a half yearly license of Ten Dollars, for each additional alley, gallery, billard or pool table to be used in same building or place. Every place where balls are thrown, targets shot at, or billiards or pool are played, open to the public; with or without price, shall be deemed a bowling alley, or shooting gallery, or billiard or poolroom as the case may be under this section.

It shall be unlawful for any owner er proprietor of any bowling alley, hooting gallery, billiard room or pool com to allow any person under the ze of 18 years, to be or remain b .. about his place of business, at any

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer and after Its approval by the Mayor, it shall be in orce an deffect on and after the 10th lay of May, 1909.
