J. T. COCHRAN TRANSLATES  
COMMENTS TO THE ENGLISH

Former La Grande Girl Scoring Remarkable Success in Spain—Papers Speak in Strong Terms of Her Skill—Translations Read Smoothly.

Because it is of local color from two view points, the Observer publishes the appended excerpts from a Spanish paper of recent date. The clippings reflect and tell in strong terms of the signal success attained in Europe by Miss Felece Lyne who once lived in La Grande and has many friends here now. In addition to that the extracts were perfectly and smoothly translated from the Spanish by Attorney George T. Cochran who is a linguist of some note. The translation as made by him read:

Extract from "La Voz de Guipuzcoa" of March 5, 1909. San Sebastian, Spain.—A most select audience were present at the artistic concert of yesterday in the Grand Casino, in order to listen to the beautiful American artist, Madam Lyne, who left well established the reputation which she enjoys in other countries.

Her beautiful voice of light soprano, flexible, of great range and fine timbre, and her facility of execution, united with an exquisite art, caused true pleasure among the numerous devotees who heard her and who predicted to the young artist unbounded success in the new role to which she intends to devote her talents, as Madam Lyne will appear in the operas.

**Farwell Concert to Madam Lyne.**  
This enchanting artist gave yesterday her farwell concert in the beautiful Festival Hall of the Grand Casino, captivating the numerous and distinguished auditors with that exquisite art which distinguishes her and with the delicious timbre of her voice which causes indeed a most grateful feeling. Hearing her in such pieces as the Melodia from Tosst, l'UHima Canzona, and in the tremulous notes of the Aria de Peline from Mignoa and in l'Eis from Chamblade, it is understood that the audience applauded with clamorous enthusiasm on account of such most remarkable singing, which will surely bring her many triumphs in her career.

Madam Lyne is very young, almost a child, an in the short time which she has given to the study of vocal music so great has been the progress which she has made that her teacher, Madam Marchesse, does not hesitate to call her the "coming star of the opera," which, coming from the lips of so illustrious a teacher, is very flattering.

To the vociferous applause of the audience, this elegant artist responded with a repetition of the sentimental and spiritual Melodia from Tosst, which will surely be one of the most appreciated in the repertoire of all dilettanti.
