LA GRANDE'S FLOAT IN ROSE FESTIVAL PLANNED

As an earnest awakening of La Grande to her opportunities the float designed for the Portland rose festival is entitled to a high place. The principal feature of the design is an enormous sugar beet (Publicity Manager Currey says he had a hard time to get the artist to draw a beet instead of an elongated carrot), which furnishes the base upon which the other parts of the float rest. The leaves of the beet make a graceful canopy. Supporting the crown, or largest part of the beet there will be three very large Grande Ronde apples, with paint on their faces. They will appear so natural, except in point of size, and that will not be exaggerated so very much!—that it is doubtful if Willamette valley people, who, it is said, are used to wiping the moss off an apple before biting it, will allow us to keep the float intact until the end of the festival. Out of deference to the city across the mountains which is to act as hostess, roses, also gorgeously colored, will form no inconspicuous feature of the float, and a branch of Cove cherries will appear, as it were, as the finishing touch.

BRADLEY'S DEATH WAS GRUESOME SAYS LETTER

All known details in connection with the death of Melvin A. Bradley at Evanston, Wyo., last week were received here yesterday by secretary C. E. Happersett of the Trainmen's order from official of that order at Evanston. The death was a horrible one. It seems that Bradley had been called to go out with a fruit train and when 10 miles out from Evanston had been ordered up ahead to ventilate some cars. That was the last seen of him, alive. He was found at daylight, his head on the inside of the track and his body on the outside. His chest and arms were horribly mangled. A few shreds of clothing was all that held the head and body together. Decapitation had been complete. A coroner's inquest was held on the 10th and the remains have been shipped to Pueblo for interment. The young wife is almost paralyzed with grief.

BELL THRILLS BAKER CITY

Rev. J. R. N. Bell, who addressed the Knight Templars in Baker City yesterday, passed through La Grande this morning enroute to Eugene, where his presence is required tomorrow at the District Presbytery. Doctor Bell intended to stop over in La Grande today with Doctor and Mrs. P. E. Moore, but received a message this morning which made it imperative that he be in Eugene tomorrow. He is chairman of the Educational committee of the Presbytery, a very important post, and felt that he could not in justice be absent.

There are many friends of the eloquent clergyman in La Grande who would have been glad of the opportunity to greet him, and will regret that he could not remain. Baker City papers speak very highly of his address of yesterday, and his hearers cannot give him praise enough. His ability as an orator and thinker, keeps pace with his advancing years, and those who heard him yesterday declared that after listening to his addresses for many years, the

greatest treat of all had been given them in yesterday's effort.
