FOURTEEN NEW AUTOS

Union county has the automobile craze. Notwithstanding, that sales of light cars have been heavy this season, another consignment of 14 Ford five-passenger touring cars are rolling to La Grande and will be here shortly. L. C. Smith the local dealer for that machine has been informed that the consignment has been shipped and he expects arrival of one car almost momentarily. The lot is coming in two cars.

Added to those already sold this year and the several pending sales, the total 1909 cars will almost double the number of machines in Union county ever last year. In fact, were it more convenient to order, practically another dozen of the touring car variety could be disposed right now, but before the order could be filled considerable of the spring early season would be at an end.

This will stand in the way of lively sales from now on.

BUY FARES TO TERMINAL

Through tickets can be purchased to Union city and Cove, commencing today and continuing hereafter. The bulletins issued some time ago and announced by the Observer at the time, were misinterpreted here and instead of becoming effective in early May, the tickets are on sale today.

The new arrangement does not lower the price of fares to Union, but eliminates the purchase of a second ticket at Union station. The price to Union is 65 cents. Cove too, comes under this arrangement and tickets can be purchased here for \$1.00.

JEFFERSON'S ANNIVERSARY IS CELEBRATED TODAY

DESCENDANTS OF SIGNERS OF CONSTITUTION MEET

President and Mrs. Taft Receive Members—Jefferson Was Born 176 Years Ago.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 13.—President and Mrs. Taft received the descendants of the signers, a society of lineal descendants of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, at the White House on Easter Monday. The occasion was the quarterly meeting of the board of governors of the organization.

The reception at the White House took place in the afternoon. Immediately before this the members of the society visited the Department of State to see "the immortal document" which was signed by their ancestors. At night they held an entertainment at the Arlington Hotel, among the speakers at which were members of the Cabinet, United States Senators and foreign diplomats.

Today, the 376th anniversary of the birthday of Thomas Jefferson, the descendants go from Washington to visit the University of Virginia at Charlottesville and the tomb of Jefferson at his old home, Monticello. Dr. E. A. Alderman, president of the university, and members of the faculty welcomed them. The visitors took part in the Founders Day exercises and afterward will be entertained at luncheon on the university commons.

Ordinance No. 416, Series 1909. An Ordinance amending Section 6 of Ordinance No. 56, Series 1887, entitled an Ordinance to license and regulate certain callings and employments.

THE CITY OF LA GRANDE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1. That Section 6 of Ordinance No. 56 Series 1887, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 6. That any person wishing to open up or keep a bowling alley, shooting gallery, billiard room or pool room shall pay a license according to the number of alleys, galleries, billiard or pool tables belonging to or used in the building or place to be licensed, as follows: for one alley, gallery, billiard or pool table, the applicant shall pay a half yearly license of Fifteen Dollars, and a half yearly license of Ten Dollars, for each additional alley, gallery, billiard or pool table to be used in same building or place. Every place where balls are thrown, targets shot at, or billiards or pool are played, open to the public, with or without price, shall be deemed a bowling alley, or shooting gallery, or billiard or poolroom as the case may be under this section.

It shall be unlawful for any owner or proprietor of any bowling alley, shooting gallery, billiard room or pool room to allow any person under the age of 18 years to be or remain in or about his place of business, at any time.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer and after its approval by the Mayor, it shall be in force and effect on and after the 10th day of May, 1909.

Passed the Council on the 7th day of April, 1909 by seven members voting therefor.
