G. A. R. HEAR LECTURE

DEPARTMENT COMMANDER VISITS LOCAL POST TODAY

Man Who Was Member of First Oregon Cavalry Lectures to Local Post—Many Attend Meeting.

T. J. Apperson, commander of the Department of Oregon, G. A. R., is in La Grande today on a visit to the Post here. Mr. Apperson is a pioneer of the state and saw service in the First Oregon Cavalry under Colonel George B. Curry. He visited a part of the day with Henry Allen, who is here as the guest of his brother, George Allen. Mr. Allen is also a prominent figure in G. A. R. councils, having crossed the continent several times as delegate to national encampments.

Mr. Apperson is a regent of the Oregon Agricultural College. This afternoon at 1:30 Mr. Apperson addressed the joint gathering of the G. A. R. and the W. R. C. His talk was nothing less than inspiring to his hearers, and they went away well pleased indeed with the visit of their department commander.

He told them of the conditions of posts in Oregon and a brief way of what the national department is doing. He pleaded with them to devote united attention to the welfare of the local post.
