PASSING

The olden wooden Baptist church building is being torn down.

As a more news item, the statement of little importance, but to a large number of La Grande people, some of them the children or grandchildren of those who had to do with the first organization of a Baptist church in this community, the passing of the olu building will recall many memories. The history of the early struggles of the Baptist church in La Grande from which thisstory is taken was written by the last remaining charter member of the church, Maria J. Lewis and H. P. Lewis. Mrs. Lewis died some years ago, and H. P. Lewis. Mrs. Lewis died some years ago, and H. P. Lewis is now the only one left of the original band who felt the need of and deserve credit of the work that was done long ago.

"At Liberty schoolhouse, near La Grande. Oregon, on the third Sunday ery Monday evening in Castle Hall in November, 1873, a meeting was a Baptist church; Elder L. J. Booth, of Cove, acting as moderator and F. T. Dick, as clerk pro tem.

The following brothers and sisters vere enrolled as charter members. Rev. B. H. Lewis, Mary J. Lewis, George Horsepool, Eliza Horsepool. H. P. Lewis, Maria J. Lewis and F. r. Dick.

On motion, Elder L. J. Booth and Rev. B. H. Harris were lected to draft articles of faith and the church covenant, which were read and adopted."

Leaving the exact language of the minutes, we find that Rev. B. H. Lewis wag called as pastor and served without salary. The new church was called Liberty church. In June, 1874. the church prepared a letter and sent delegates to the association at Wingville, in Baker county.

At this association Rev. Lewis was ordained, and the church was received into the association.

To quote again from the language of the history, "Those were ploneer days, three or four families entertaining about thirty delegates and visitors. But it was a glorious meeting. the Lord being with us in great power."

In June, 1883, the Association was held with Liberty church, the Methodists giving the use of their building in La Grande for the meetings.


