CREDITORS IN MEETING

A meeting of the creditors of W. R. Kivette was held yesterday afternoon in the office of John S. Hodgkin, referee in bankruptcy. Several claims were allowed, and some were rejected. The main purpose of the meeting, aside from the hearing of a suit in replevin for the recovery of a horse and buggy, brought against the referee by Mrs. D. C. Kivette, was to discuss the condition of the affairs of the estate. Kivette's affairs are in a very tangled condition, and it is probable that after the partnership business is settled, there will be little or nothing left for the creditors. As yet not a cent has been realized for their benefit, and it will be some time before the litigation incident to the partnership in the North Powder firm is settled.

Death of Worden Hathaway.

Worden Hathaway, a pioneer of this part of the State, died at his home, near Carson, Oregon, April 14, 1909. The funeral will take place from Cook Bros' undertaking rooms, in Union, Saturday, April 17, 1909, at 10 o'clock a. m., under the auspices of Grand Ronde Valley Lodge No. 56, A. F. & A. M., of which Mr. Hathaway was a charter member. The members of Putnam Post, G. A. T. of which Mr. Hathaway was also a member, will participate in the funeral. Mr. Hathaway was 75 years of age, and leaves a wife and three children to mourn his loss, and many old friends who have known him in this part of the State for a quarter of a century. He was a good citizen and will be missed by all who have known him.—Union Republican.
