WALLA WALLA, April 17.—That the peach crop of this section will be Weekly, six months in advance. ... The nimost total failure and the apple only about half, is the assertion J. L. Dumas of Dayton, who is in Walla Walls. Mr. Dumas bases his belief on the observations which he has made in his own orchard and that of J. D. Taggard in the Touchet valley near Waltsburg, and from reports which he has received from other fruit men.

Failure of the peach crop is due to the fact that fruit raisers neglected to irrigate at the proper time, and to their neglect to sufficiently thin their orchards. "I have not seen a single live bud this spring in the peach orchards," said Mr. Dumas. "Of course it may be possible that on some of the upland orchards the crop will be good, but in the irrigated districts the crops would seem at this time to be a total

The crop of apples will be only half this year from appearances. Reason for this shortage is ascribed to the heavy crops of the past two years and the failure of orchardists to thin their trees sufficiently.
