LOG RAFT.

7,000,000 Feet to be Sent to San Francisco.
Another big cigar-shaped log raft, the first of the season will soon be ready to send from Stella to San Francisco, containing about 7,000,000 feet of lumber. The raft has practically been built and the second one for the same destination is well under way. There will be more similar rafts sent from the Columbia river to California this season than formerly. The steamer, Olympic, Captain Hansen, arriving from San Francisco last night, brought 125 tons of chain for lashing the logs together. She stopped at Stella for discharging the material yesterday afternoon, or she would have reached here much earlier. In addition to the chain the Olympic brought 500 tons of general merchandise, the bulk of which is being discharged at Columbia dock No. 1. The remainder of the cargo will be discharged at the Oak-street dock. On the return trip the Olympic will take out a cargo of lumber, comprising 750,000 feet. It will be delivered to San Pedro firms.—Telegram.
