NORTHWEST BREVITIES

The first attempt at Anti-Oriental legislation in the state of Washington occurred at yesterday's meeting of the Seattle city council when a member of the license and revenue committee proposed an amendment to the pending automobile ordinance prohibiting any but citizens or those who have declared their intention of becoming such from holding licenses as automobile chauffeurs.

Klamath Falls citizens expect to see the first train draw into the town about May 15. The Chamber of Commerce is perfecting arrangements for a celebration of railroad day on May 20. Excursions will be run from San Francisco, Sacramento and Portland.

An election is being held in Forest Grove today to decide whether the city shall be bonded for \$70,000 to bring water from Clear Creek, nine miles west, for a gravity system for the place. If the vote carries, the town indebtedness will be about \$100,000. The present plant cost \$30,000.

The Union Pacific attorneys are endeavoring to have the old Chicago-Spokane rate of \$3.60 per hundred restored, claiming that the rate established by the Interstate Commerce Commission, \$3.00, is unremunerative to the road they represent because their route from Chicago to Spokane is 416 miles longer than either the Great Northern or Northern Pacific.

The Baptist Ministerial Association of Portland have denounced Christian Science as a fake doctrine, and will try to enlist the physicians and surgeons of the city in a fight to stop the spread of the Christian Science teaching and consequent inroad on professional earnings.

Arthur B. Waltz, pastor of the University Park church, and a former Baker City boy, is one of the leaders in the aggressive movement.
