SUPREME COURT SITS.
 Long Term in Sight. Number of Cases From This County.

Quite a number of Union county cases will come up before the State Supreme court at Pendleton next Monday. Among them one of the most interesting to residents of this county is that of Julius Roesch vs Union county. The attorneys for Mr. Roesch are C. H. Finn and B. F. Wilson. For the state will appear A. M. Crawford, F. S. Ivanhoe, and John S. Hodgkin. This is the case arising from the effort of Mr. Roesch to secure an injunction restraining the county court from declaring the result of the June election and making it of record.

Other cases of interest are State of Oregon vs P. A. McDonald; Edward Brasel vs Oregon Railroad & Navigation company; and Mrs. William Rynearson and Bart Owsley vs Union county.

There are 36 cases in all on the docket, of which number 10 originated in this county. Another interesting case is that of the State vs C. Sam Smith, accused of setting fire to the buildings and plant of the J. N. Williamson sheep ranch on the headwaters of Ochooc creek in Grant county.

PROGRESS OF WOMAN SUFFRAGE.
 The Iowa Woman Suffrage Association has addressed a letter to each candidate for the State Legislature asking him what action he will take on the woman suffrage question, if elected, and telling him that if he does not reply before a certain date, his silence will be construed as opposition. The suffragists resent the treatment they received at the hands of the Legislature this last winter and they propose to let the members know it.

The Central Labor Council of Los Angeles, Cal. on April 2 adopted a set of resolutions strongly endorsing woman suffrage and recommending all members to sign the woman suffrage petition to Congress. On April 8, the District Council of Carpenters of Philadelphia took similar action, pledging "to assist the Pennsylvania Woman Suffrage Association in securing signatures to the National Petition to Congress to submit to the Legislature of the several States for ratification an amendment to the National Constitution which shall enable women to vote."

While the women of the United States are being admonished on every hand not to emulate the example of the English suffragettes, an Ohio editor is suggesting "What the women should do is to forebly release every woman prisoner confined in any place, and take forcible possession of every woman's institution." He says, "Taxation, correction, every application of law should be resisted forcibly and I wish the rebellion would start in Ohio."

If the weather does not turn warmer next week the committee in charge of the carnival have arranged to secure the 8,000 snudge stoves from the fruit growers on May Park and Fruitdale, and will warm up the city.
