## RESOLUTIONS OF CONGRESS

Resolved, that this convention of the Oregon-Idaho Development League held at La Grande, Ore. April 27-28, 1909, viewing with satisfaction the progress in every material way that has been made in the great states of Oregon and Idaho during the year just past, pledges its members to co-operate in securing a continuance of that progress, and urges the co-operation of those not members in the attainment of that end.

The greatest progress and the highest degree of prosperity can be attained only through increased population. To secure such increased population and assure it profitable employment, all irrigation projects should be encouraged to the end that the soil should be made more productive—that two blades of grass should be made to grow where but one blade now grows.

Competition in transportation also should be encouraged to the end that such competition should enlighten the burdens resting upon the producers of the country. This encouragement should particularly apply to all electric lines projected or to be projected—those arteries which experience has shown to be a country's best developers.

We believe that the proper spirit of co-operation will secure to any community whose location and resources will justify it, development along the lines of irrigation and electric railroads.

In fact we desire to submit, with your approval, the gospel of self help. We believe that the proper degree of faith, backed by the proper amount of work, will move mountains.

We favor co-operation by the state and national governments in the improvement of our harbors and the opening of our inland waterways. Water competition is a factor of such vital force in restraining the greed of railroad companies, that any reasonable cost is cheap which secures to shippers the benefits of such competition.
