## DETAILS ARE COMPLETED

The entries, twelve in all, of La Grande for the tri-state track meet were received this morning, says the Walla Walla Bulletin of yesterday, making 19 schools which have replied to the invitation. Those of Pomeroy high school are expected tonight or tomorrow, and it understood now that Pendleton academy also intends sending a team.

Besides the gold, silver and bronze medals to be given to the winners of first, second and third places respectively in each event, five cups have also been donated by local citizens as special prizes. To the winner of the high school half-mile relay will be given a cup donated by the Walla Walla Paper and Stationery Company, while to the winner of the quarter-mile relay among the local grade school a cup donated by the Malcolm McLeen Grocery Company will be awarded. To the winner of the quarter-mile relay among the local grade school winning the meet a cup given by Schwabachers will be awarded, while to the individual securing the greatest number of points in the meet Senator Ankeny has provided the cup.

The same plan used in pulling off the preliminaries used last year will be used again this year. On account of the large number of heats, the quarter, 200, 100 and 50-yard dashes will be run in five heats, while the hurdles, half-mile and mile will be run off in four heats. The men finishing first and second in each of these heats will be eligible to compete in the finals on the following day, which will be finished in one heat.
