PITTSBURG, April 30.—The heaviest snowfall of the winter in Western Pennsylvania, began last night, and at Bradford today the snow was 10 inches deep and still falling. Snow shovels stored away for the summer had to be brought out again to clear the tracks of the Western New York & Pennsylvania Traction Company. All traffic is experiencing delays. Trees are loaded down and many telegraph and telephone wires have been broken. In Pittsburg the weather is mild and two thunder storms early today were suggestive of summer.
