With seven men entered and a possibility of having Young during the meet, La Grande has a fair chance of making the best showing since it participated in this affair. Since Saturday the squad has been doing light work, recuperating as best they can from the effects of the Union meet which will be detrimental to the best results this week.

Englehorn will also meet Dresser in h etshot putting contest, and as both men are tossing the sphere close to 40 feet, that event will be interesting.
