## ATHLETES OFF FOR MEET

Eight determined, well muscled members of the La Grande track team took their departure this morning for Walla Walla to enter the tri-state meet. That they are confident of putting La Grande on the northwest athletic map with such vividness as has never before been a fact, is easily noticeable, but what they will actually do is another matter. Carpy and Williamson will enter all the sprints, while the captain will go after a point or two in the broad jump, and Williamson will enter the low hurdle and the broad jump. Reynolds will be a potent factor in both the low hurdles and the quarter, while Pearce will make a strenuous effort to duplicate his performance of Saturday in the high hurdles. He may also enter the half. Frank and Jay Millering are entered in the pole vault and high jump, and Frank will take part in the discuss, and then his brother in the half mile. Heidenrich will enter all the weights. Young will enter in the high hurdles and the pole vault. As is well known, 20 points should win the meet, and while it is hardly possible that La Grande can come home with the laurels, there will be some disappointment if several from here do not win their spurs.

## INTEREST INCREASING

No more startling animal act was ever witnessed here than that of Mr. Altamore and the group of monster Nubian lions, and while bears are not much of a novelty out in this section, the clown bear, "Barnes" introduced in conjunction with the lions is undoubtedly trained to a point almost unapproachable by any other forest bred animal. And what is said of the animals may be said also of the numerous other attractions featured by the Parker management. One naturally expects to find the more pretentious attractions such as the animal circus, "The Broadway Belles," and Pharaoh's Daughter" meritorious and well worth the price of admission charged, and so they are, but the one who imagines that only the larger attractions are worth while will miss some of the best and most interesting sights on the funway. Taking them individually it may be stated that each is representative of the best in its particular field, and there is something in connection with each one that either amuses, interests, or instructs. Collectively they undoubtedly comprise one of the cleanest, biggest, best comprehensive and best amusement organizations ever fostered by any individual management.
