The new Pacific Express rates recently ordered by the Oregon Railroad Commission, are good both ways according to a letter sent out by Oswald West in answer to inquiries coming from Eastern Oregon on this subject. The first impression was that only Portland-to-La Grande rates were changed, but Mr. West says this is a mistake. To illustrate the assertion: The old rate from Pendleton to La Grande was \$1.25, while the new one is \$1.10. A proportionate reduction has been made from Portland to La Grande. Many La Grande shippers will be elated at this interpretation of the new ruling.

Another feature which appeals to Union county is that fraits and vegetables classified as "general specials." are based on a neccentage of the "merchandise" rates and the ordr will therefor reduce these fruit rates as well as merchandise rates.

All kinds of vegetables are to be found in the stores of the city these days. It is true that the season for spinach and one or two other green stuffs is nearly past, but others are coming in to take their places. Strawberries have been on sale for two weeks, and the quality is steadily improving. Home grown onions, lettuce and asparagus are already in the market, or will be by the first of the coming week. Prices are gradually getting lower and the spring delicacies. if we may call them so, are within the reach of more tables every weak.
