COURT SITS FOR MAY

This morning the county commissioners met in regular monthly session, and spent the day principally in auditing bills. It is probable, before the court adjourns that the commissioners will take up several matters of great importance to the county at large, the one of the most general interest being the purchase of a poor farm. The commissioners realize that the county needs a poor farm more centrally located than the old one was, and have been looking for a suitable location since the sale of the one at Union. As yet they have, for various reasons been unable to decide. There is the difficulty of selecting a proper place at the same time keeping the expenditure of county funds down. From the sale of the old farm \$2,000 was realized, and it is desired by the commissioners to make this amount come as near as possible to defraying the cost of a new farm. Some time this summer, though probably not at this time, the court will advertise bids for the construction of a steel bridge across the river at Perry. Tomorrow some time the court will take up the matter of making the county jail secure.
