## BID MOTHERS TO SERVICES

Sunday school superintendent W. L. Brenholts and the teachers of the Presbyterian church are sending out invitations to the Mother's Day service next Sunday, to the mother of every child in the Sunday school. In addition to the Mother's Day sermon by Rev. Seeman, pastor of the church, there will be special music and other features to add to the pleasure of the service. The invitation, signed by the teacher and Mr. Brenholts, read as follows:

"Sunday May 9th, is to be observed as 'MOTHER'S DAY' in our church and our pastor has prepared specially attractive services for both morning and evening, well calculated to exalt the dignity of motherhood and give us an opportunity to show our appreciation of the 'MOTHERS OF MEN' and especially of our own dear mothers."

You are a mother and have interest in our Sunday school. In keeping with the sentiment of this day we would especially like to have you present at the Sunday School or that morning to see what we are trying to do for you and yours and to encourage the children by your presence with us."

## NEARBEER LAW MAY BE DELAYED

It is doubtful if the ordinance pertaining to the regulation of nearbeer joints will pass at the council meeting tonight. In addition to there being some unwillingness on the part of some of the councilmen in regard to certain of its provisions, there is quite a sentiment in favor of holding the matter in abeyance until the decision of the supreme court in the case brought against the county by Julius Roesch is handed down. That case is to be argued today, but it is probable that the decision of the bench will not be known much before the end of the month. Councilmen argue that it will be practically useless to pass such an ordinance when there is a chance that the result of the June election will be nullified in the near future.

The ordinance as introduced provides that any place where nearbeer or other non-intoxicating beverages are sold shall contain but one room, with no screens or other obstructions to a clear view of the whole room from the outside, and that there shall be no communication with any other room; that the lower part of the windows, to consist of not more than one pane in thickness, shall not be more than 3 and 1-2 feet above the sidewalk; that no minors shall be allowed in the places at all; that they shall be closed at 12 o'clock every week day night, and shall so remain until 5 o'clock in the morning; that on Saturday night they shall be closed at midnight and remain closed until Monday morning. All such places must be open to police inspection at all times, and it is made the duty of the police to make such inspection.

**Protection Ordinance Tonight.**

In as much as the city is now without protection in the matter of adequate fire escapes in public buildings, hotels, etc., the ordinance that provides for the number of exits and fire escapes in such buildings will probably be passed tonight. There is an emergency clause attached, and if the ordinance is passed it will become effective at once.

There are a good many citizens interested in the near beer ordinance, and there is likely to be a considerable number at tonight's meeting.
