NORTHWEST BREVITIES

Fine Bootleggers.

A dispatch from Pendleton says that four bootleggers have been fined or imprisoned within two days.

Coos Bay Men Push Railroad.
At a large meeting of the Coos Bay Chamber of Commerce held Friday night several thousand dollars were subscribed towards a survey and incorporation of the Coos Bay Central Oregon and Boise railroad. Work will begin in the near future.

Will Not Raise Rates.
At a meeting of the Seattle restaurant keepers association, pledges were given to I. A. Nadeau, director general of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition that prices would not be raised before the present standard during the fair this summer. The association represents 52 of the leading cafes in the city.

Scarlet Fever Closes Schools.
A part of the schools at Wallace, Idaho, are closed on account of an epidemic of scarlet fever among the children of that city.

Lewiston Bond Election.
The school board of Lewiston, Idaho, will call an election to submit to the people a proposition of bonding the school district for \$55,000 to be used in constructing new buildings.

Governor Sets Out Trees.
T. T. Mungers, forest expert, is now at Rosland, in southern Oregon, and is ready to begin experiments in reforestation in that vicinity. Mr. Mungers expects to lay off three plots of about one acre each and try three methods, one to scatter pine seeds broadcast, another to plant seeds with a corn planter and a third to plant some yellow pine seedlings from the government nursery stock. Mr. Mungers says it will probably take four or five years before anything can be told as to what the outcome of the experiment will be.
