TRAINMEN TO WORK LESS

A dispatch from Sacramento, Calif., to the Oregonian says:
The grievance committee of the Order of Railway Conductors and the Order of Railway Trainmen, has received a report that the Southern Pacific has granted important concessions.
According to the report, conductors and brakemen on passenger trains will be on duty 17, instead of 21 days a month, conductors being granted \$150 per month and brakemen \$99.50. Freight crews are to have full 10 hours between trips. Theoretically they get this now, but calls are made two hours earlier.
A relief crew was put on between Red Bluff and Ashland for passenger service, so crews can have three consecutive days' vacation each month. These crews have been making 206 miles daily, although 197 miles is usually reckoned as a day's run. No extra pay has been allowed. Increased overtime will now be paid.
Train crews asked for these concessions in anticipation of heavy traffic during the summer. Engineers and firemen are paid mileage and have asked no concessions.
