Fred G. Taylor leaves Wednesday or Thursday of next week with his family for Lewiston, Utah, where he assumes the management of the largest sugar factory owned by the Amalgamated Sugar Company. His resignation as manager of the La Grande factory was accepted some time ago, and he has only been waiting the full settlement of his business affairs here before announcing the time of his departure. His decision to leave La Grande after three full years of management of the local factory, was reached only by reason of the fact that he is bettering his position financially and other wise. "I think more of La Grande than other place on earth," said Mr. Taylor today, "and I leave it reluctantly. If it were not for the fact that I am going to a much better position, leaving La Grande would be farthest from my thoughts."

Commercially La Grande losses one of its staunchest citizens, for Mr. Taylor has been identified with every worthy movement meaning the betterment of the city morally and commercially.

A. Thomas, at present connected with the factory, will be temporary manager of the factory while F. S. Bramwell takes the general supervision of the fields.
