Grande Ronde, the beautiful, has another solid substantial friend. Mr. I. E. D. Zundel, who returned to La Grande about a week ago after a tour of investigation including the Willamette and Rogue River valley in Oregon, the Sacramento valley in California and a good share of Nevada, declares with emphasis that he found nothing that looks half so good as the Grande Ronde. He stopped in Hood River, ate their apples, likewise in the famous Rogue river; and found the quality not one whit better than we have right here at home.

Admitting freely that both these sections can raise a very few varieties of apples that will not mature properly in this valley, yet says Mr. Zundel, "We have them all beaten. They have not the soil, not the climate, I looked carefully, and learned everything that I could, for I was looking for a permanent location, and I was compelled to come back to old Grande Ronde for a home."

Mr. Zundel bought an 80 acre farm upon his return. The land lies north of Al Good's place, and was purchased from Mr. Wilson. It is all farm land, and will be under the Meadowbrook irrigation canal.

There is great local interest in the assessment of Union county now under way and the tax-payer is wondering where he will land upon the new basis of fixing property valuations. It seems more than likely that unless the cities of the State double and add a half to their valuations, the country districts will rebel, and the Board of Equalization will be asked to reduce the valuations. The outcome of the new method of assessment will be watched with interest.—Union Republican.
