HOUSE SMALL SHOW GOOD

Quite often this winter, good crowds and good shows have played tag, but, too often, never meet at the Seward at the right time. Last evening a mere handful of people listened to one of the best, if not the best, production in its line that has been here since the "Man of the Hour," captivated La Grande. Rather unusual, explains the mechanical points of the play. The climax comes in the third act and from then on it is retribution and, finally, non-tragedy ending. It is purely a man's play and while moral strength see-saws up to the final curtain, morality finally reigns and the listener goes home with a well-taught moral ranking in his breast. But for a few weak spots in the cast, the plays is a continuous run of lines with ante and post climaxes that pleases all.

MOTOR CARS ORDERED

There is no longer a doubt about the O. R. & N. putting motor cars on its branch lines to compete with electric lines this summer, for orders have been placed by the O. R. & N. with the McKeen Company at Omaha for two new motor cars costing \$18,000 each, for use on the Walla Walla-Walla and Dayton Walla Walla branches. The cars are expected here before the middle of the summer, crossing the continent under their own power. Some of the trains now in service will be discontinued at that time.

The cars will have seating accommodations for 70 people, parlor and smoking car as well as baggage and mail compartments.

Activity in electric railroad construction and plans is said to be the main cause for the decision of the company to put on the cars this early.

Episcopal Congress in Boston.
BOSTON, Mass., May 11.—The twenty-seventh annual session of the congress of Episcopal dioceses of this country met in Trinity church this morning. It will continue four days, but the services and discussions after the first one will be held in Tremont Temple. Bishop Lawrence presided. The session last year was at Detroit.

Among the speakers are Bishop Edward M. Parker, of New Hampshire; Canon Henson, of England; Bishop Doane, of Albany; Dr. Huntington, of Grace church, New York; President Luther, of Trinity College, Hartford; Rev. Percy Grant, formerly of Boston; Editor Silas McBee, of the Churchman; Dr. Lloyd and President Charles Henry Babcock, of New York.

A reception to the congress will be given by the Episcopalian club tonight, and a visit to the Episcopal Theological Seminary and to Harvard University is planned for the members.
