LABOR SERVICES ON NEXT SUNDAY ATTRACT NOTICE

"The Methodist Federation for Social Service," was organized in Washington, D. C., December 3, 1907. Its purposes, as expressed in its constitution are, to "deepen within the church the sense of social obligation and opportunity, to study social problems from the Christian point of view, and to promote social service in the spirit of Jesus Christ."

In accordance with this purpose, the Federation issued a call to all pastors to observe May 9, in the interests of labor, but that day following a busy week, and also being asked for as "Mother's Day," it seemed wise to postpone the special services until next Sabbath, May 16, when both morning and evening services will be given to the subject of "Social Service."

In the morning the choir will favor the audience with special music. The sermon will be on the subject, "The Laborer's Best Friend," and the evening service will consist of several short addresses, and special music of special interest to all interested in our great economic questions. All are cordially invited, especially all laboring people.
