NEW TRAINS TO WALLOWA

Wallowa towns and newspapers have been trying to "run down" the report that a new passenger train service is to be installed on the Joseph branch in the near future. May 24 is the date set by them on which the proposed service is to become effective.

The trains, if they are put on, will be outright passenger service, and will thus make two trains each way daily, on passenger and one freight train. This condition of traffic is bound to ensue, but just when, it is hard to forecast. Local trainmen know nothing of the rumor except that it has been discussed at various times.

It is known that O. R. & N. officials considered the feasibility of putting on motor car trains instead of steam trains. Which it will be is not known either, publicly.
