OFFICIAL SCHEDULE OF NEW TRAINS ANNOUNCED

Official announcement of the new train schedule was made today by local railroad officials, and excepting for a few minor details, all matters of importance relative to the new service can now be authentically announced. The service commences tomorrow, but the west bound schedule will not be assumed until trains can reach here from Chicago, probably Tuesday. From the west, however, the schedule is effective tomorrow and trains will arrive on the new time.

In many ways the new arrangement is better for La Grande, but the new trains were not put on for La Grande's benefit, but to shorten the time between Chicago and Portland.

There are two trains daily that run on the increased schedule. The other two trains each way are local and semi-local affairs. Numbers 7 and 8 are limited and stop on at the important places along the route. They will carry no express whatever.

Numbers 5 and 6 are something similar to what is now 1 and 2, stopping at important places and few of the smaller towns. Eleven and 12 are local trains purely stopping at everything where stops can be made.

The schedule, official, which becomes effective tomorrow follows:
Westward—Number 5, Oregon Express, arrive at La Grande, 8 P. M.; leave 8:05. Number 7, Portland Special arrive 9:25 A. M.; leave 9:30. Number 11, Pacific Express, arrives 5:25 A. M.; leaves 5:30.
Eastward—Number 6, Eastern Ex-

press, arrives 6:15 A. M.; leaves 6:20. Number 8, Chicago Special arrives 8:30 P. M.; leaves 8:35. Number 12 Atlantic Express arrives 9:15 P. M.; leaves 9:20.

Arriving Time in Portland.
Number 7 arrives in Portland 8 P. M. Number 11 at 6 P. M. Number 5 at 7:20 A. M.

Portland Leaving Time.
Number 12 leaves Portland 8:10 A. M. Number 8, 10 A. M. Number 6, 6 P. M.

No Change On Joseph Run.
There will be no change whatever on the Joseph-La Grande or La Grande-Joseph runs. They connect with local trains here and continue on the same schedule as heretofore.
