FOUR STIRRING SPEECHES AT LABOR SUNDAY SERVICES

The special "Labor Problem," services held Sunday evening at the Methodist church drew a large and appreciative audience. The special music being a feature greatly enjoyed.

The churches, at least several of the strongest denominations, have well laid plans which are being carried out at stated annual periods where the labor problem is receiving general attention, the object being to inculcate and spread generally the teachings of the Golden Rule, which is carried out by both employer and employee, the labor problem which has been going through a slow process of evolution for centuries would speedily solve the problem. "The Golden Rule" was the topic assigned to O. Dwight Neill last evening and while there are several so-called constructions, the speaker took Mathew 7-12 as the broadest and most generally accepted. "Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them; for this is the law and the prophets." Mr. Neill brought out the fact that selfishness on the part of both the

employee and employer was the root of the labor problem and when once the idea of the golden rule became so general that both sides would reverse their view point and ask each other what would be right, and consider the responsibilities of their action and its results on their fellow man, that right and justice would prevail and not until then.

From the laborer's side of the question Henry Henson took as his text "Let us Reason Together." Theoretically at a glance, the topic was an address in itself, but it soon passed beyond the theoretical stage when Mr. Henson stated that the motto of his pioneer railroad order, the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, and had been for over a quarter of a century.

Those who are familiar with the history of this order, well know, how faithfully it has lived up to its motto. Every grievance first is brought before its local "Division" there it is carefully considered and if would be
