ENGINEER LEAVES FOR DAM SITE

With W. S. McMullin to take him to the region of Meadowbrook, E. T. Darley, the assistant chief engineer in charge of the construction of the Meadowbrook dam, who arrived last evening after having been delayed one day, took his departure at noon to remain until the work is finished. He will locate the exact site of the dam, study the underlying strata of rock, outline the contour of the reservoir and in varied manner of ways, secure information for the directors. Mr. McMullin will assist him in the survey, and in addition, two or three men will be employed from among the residents of that part of the county. Dr. Darley will remain until all this is done, and when he will come back to La Grande is hard to estimate. It may be two weeks and perhaps 10 days will finish the work.

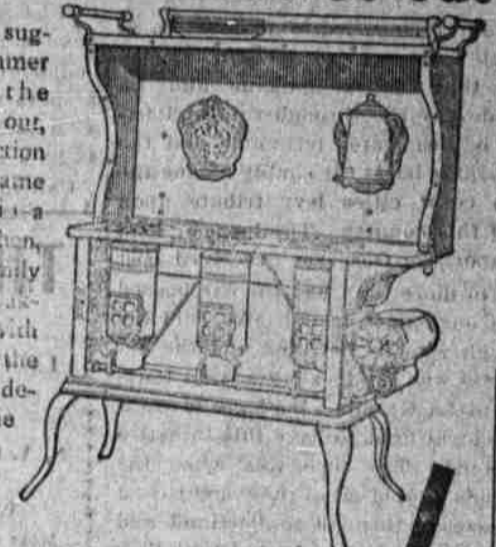
