Last night a communication from the Commercial club was presented at the council meeting asking that the city appropriate \$25.00 a month to cover one third of the cost of maintaining the incandescent illumination of Adams avenue and Depot street. The business men have subscribed \$50.00 a month toward the expense and in their communication expressed a willingness for the city to pay the balance of the lights now on these streets. In the district covered by the incandescents, to be moved to some part of town where they are more needed.

The request was referred to the proper committee and although there is some little doubt as to the efficacy of the incandescents it is expected that the report will be favorable and that the council will appropriate the necessary amount.
