UMATILLA CLIP SOLD.

More Than a Million Pounds Sold, Some at Very High Prices.

More than a million pounds of wool have been sold in the vicinity of Pendleton within the past few days and

there will be no public sales day here as a result. The J. E. Smith company's Pilot Rock clip of 70,000 pounds topped the market, being bought for 21-4 cents per pound by Ellery, for a Boston firm.

This practically cleans up the season's clip in this county and no sales day will be held here, at Pilot Rock or Echo. In fact the only sales day to be observed in the state this year is the one to be held at Shaniko tomorrow. This condition of affairs is due entirely to the activity of the woolbuyers who swarmed into the field in advance of the opening of the sales day season and by offering prices far in advance of those prevailing last year, induced the growers not to hold.
