## HOOSIERS SAY REVISION WRONG

### CLAIM ALDRICH BILL MAKES

### TARIFF HIGHER THAN NOW

Beveridge Lands Taft as Most Conservative Statesman in Republican Party—Advocates Revision of Tariff Along Protective Lines But Downward—Lumber Tariff Not to Be Decided at Present.

WASHINGTON, May 25.—Lauding President Taft as the broadest and most conservative exponent of the Republican party, Senator Beveridge in the senate today advocated a revision of the tariff downward along protective lines. He said that Taft originated the sentiment favoring revision two years ago. Senator Schively, also of Indiana, attacked the Aldrich bill, saying it will make the general tariff of the United States higher in every schedule than it is now. He argued that Taft was given a task impossible of realization in the duty imposed upon him by the maximum and minimum provisions of the tariff.

The senate finance committee postponed reconsideration of the lumber schedule until sugar rate is settled. The committee will recommend a rate of a dollar and a half per thousand feet on sawed lumber.

### Plenty of Home Made Brick.

Thursday the fires will be lighted in the first season kiln at the Geo. Kreiger brick yards. The kiln will contain 350,000 brick and by the time it is finished another kiln of a similar size will be ready for burning. It will require about two weeks to burn and cool the first kiln, then there will be brick for all kinds of building purposes and the former low price will be restored.
