NOTED CAR SEEN HERE

BEARS MARKS OF HOLD-UP AT OMAHA SATURDAY NIGHT
With Bullet Holes in Its Side and Window Broken, Mail Car of Notorious Hold-up Passes Through La Grande.

Pierced with holes from the bullets of the bandits, the mail car which was in the train held up near Omaha Saturday night and robbed of thousands of dollars, passed through La Grande this morning on the west bound train. On one side the car bore the marks of the robbery, carrying several bullet holes. One of the windows broken during the hold-up, is still without its glass, and it didn't need close inspection to learn that the car had been the object of trouble in recent times. After the car reaches Portland, it will be repaired and sent out again for regular service.

FISTFIGHT AT STEWARD

The Burns-Johnson fight for the heavyweight championship of the world, which occurred in Sydney, Australia, last December, will be reproduced by moving pictures at the Steward this afternoon and evening. These pictures, which were taken by experts the morning of the fight, are said to be the finest of the kind ever attempted. They were made in the open air at 11 o'clock of a bright summer's morning, and show the smallest detail of the 14 rounds of fast fighting, together with interesting views of the gathering of the immense crowd, incidents that occurred preliminary to the fight, and the training quarters of the two pugilists. The entire entertainment covers two hours, and will be explained by an expert lecturer, who was present in Sydney and witnessed the fight from a ring side seat.

TWO EXCURSION TRAINS.

The people of Joseph will provide teams to haul the visitors to the head of Wallowa lake, five miles away.

The games are scheduled to take place Thursday and Friday. They will return to Union Saturday night and play La Grande there Sunday.

Baker Fishermen Must Wait.
While the fishing season opened in Union county on the first of April, Baker county fishermen are bemoaning the fact that in order to legally lure the wily trout from his shadowed pool in Baker county streams they must wait until July 1st. Follows an extract from the state fishing laws:

"Trout—Baker County—It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill or have in possession any trout, except salmon trout, from any of the months of December, January, February, March, April, May and June of any year.
