NOTICES OF REWARD

Notices of \$50,000 reward, offered by the Great Northern and the United States for the capture of the men who held up a Great Northern train at Morse Siding near Spokane on May 15, have reached the hands of Chief of Police Rayburn. The posters give the description of the two men who were on the engine and assisted in the robbery as follows:

No. 1—Six feet tall, slender, dark hair and smooth shaved, wore white slouch hat with small brim, dark coat and trousers, about 35 or 40 years old, face wrinkled, weight 196 pounds.

No. 2—Five feet eight inches tall, weight about 160 or 170 pounds, dark complexion, black slouch hat with brim turned down, and hair split up in back, wore dark coat, light checked trousers, heavy tan shoes. This man understood handling of engine.

If any of the guilty parties are killed while resisting capture the Great Northern Railway Company will pay the reward above offered by it upon proof that the party killed participated in the robbery.
