At Mr. Collier's request Mr. and Mrs. Berry visited the scene of the manufacture and he writes this: "We went out to inspect the float and found them courteous and anxious to please their patrons, asking for any criticism or suggestion we might care to make. We found it a thing of beauty and worth the

pride of everyone interested in La Grande and the Grande Ronde. I wish every boy and girl in La Grande might be able to see it. There are no letters on the float. These are to be placed on a banner to be carried by footmen preceding the horses and they await your orders for the wording. Our sister county, Wallowa, also has a noticeable and effective float which will call much attention to that part of the county. We consider it was a special privilege to see the floats to be used and the manner in which they are constructed.

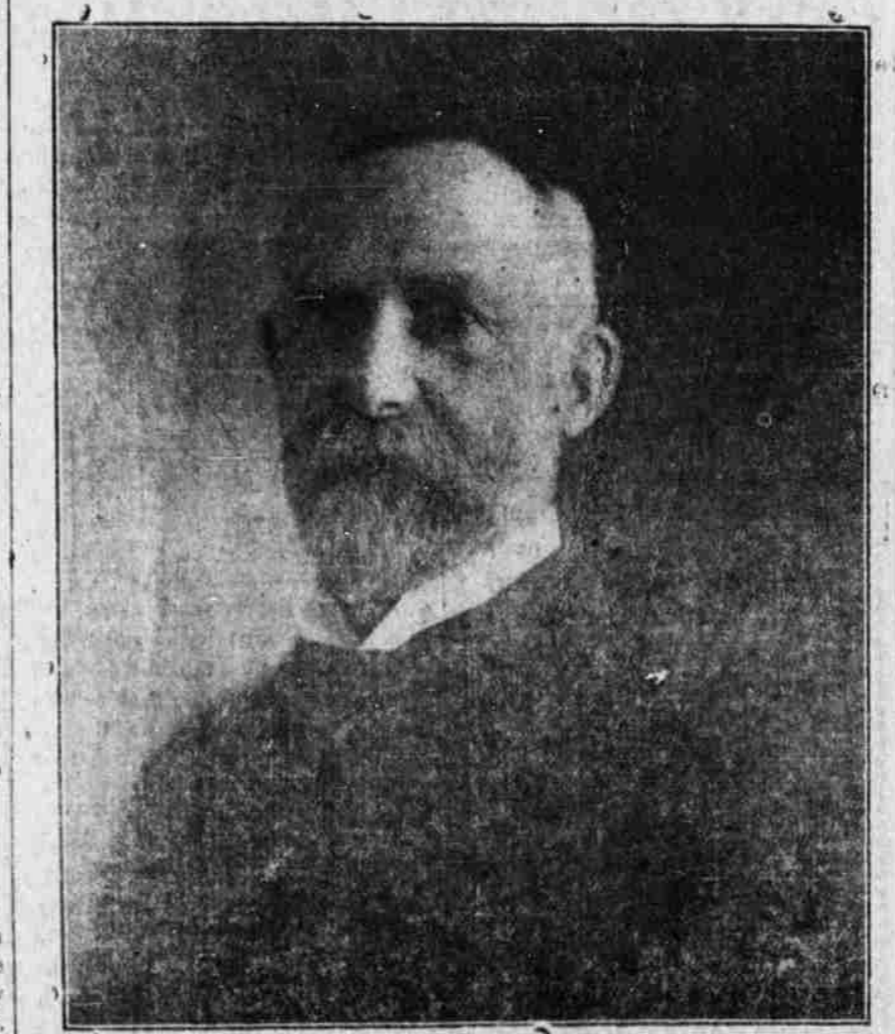
