## WOOL RATES UNDER PROBE

Oswald West has favored the Observer with a copy of a case before the railroad commission of Oregon relative to rates on wool in grease in square bales compressed to not less than 19 pounds per cubic foot, in car loads, minimum weight 30,000 pounds. The present rate of \$1.75 per 100 pounds to Baltimore, Boston, New York and Philadelphia from La Grande is said by the petitioner to be discriminatory and unjust.

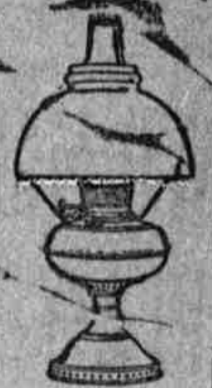
