J. K. Wright Will Improve Property by Addition of Walks.

One hundred and eighty lenial feet of cement walk will be constructed by J. K. Wright, corner Sixth and P streets. Surveyors are now establishing the grades. The walk will be 120 feet long on one side, and 60 on the other. When finished the walk will be an improvement to the street and a liberal addition to the total amount of cement walks in residence districts. There will also be 126 lenial feet of inside walks.
