SUCH A DELUSION, YES. In the course of a very enthusiastic editorial the Baker City Herald recently said:

"This city is the county seat. It is the metropolis of eastern Oregon and always will be. It is the city that carries the largest number of people that has white-collar and clerical classes; that is, in fact, the chief point for all the eastern Oregon interior country, and nothing else. It is the center of the county seat."

Baker City is a good little town and it has some very progressive people. But the town is about as much entitled to be called the metropolis of eastern Oregon as is Pilot Rock. To both with Baker City is in no sense of the word a typical eastern Oregon town. It is a mining town, like Summit, and other places that rely for support upon those who delve into the earth for metal. When the mines are running full time these towns do well, when the mines close down the grass grows up in the streets as it is now doing in Sumpter.

Then Baker City is situated in one corner of the state. It is over near the Idaho line and is connected with the rest of the state by a single railroad. There are but two or three trains a day in and out of the city. All the logging and wholesale business that Baker City does could be "put in your ear."

Pendleton is the "one and only" chief city of eastern Oregon. By virtue of its position it is the central point for this portion of the state. Three fourths of eastern Oregon lie closer to Pendleton than to Baker City. Pendleton has some transportation facilities. Aside from connection with two transcontinental lines there are a number of branch lines radiating out of the city. Sixteen passenger trains run into Pendleton daily. Last year more wool was shipped from Pendleton than from any other point west of the Mississippi. If there is ever going to be a "logging point" in eastern Oregon, Pendleton will be that point—Pendleton E. O.

There is just a possibility, always, that while Baker City and Pendleton are discussing and arguing who's who, La Grande might just possibly crawl in ahead and win the medal.

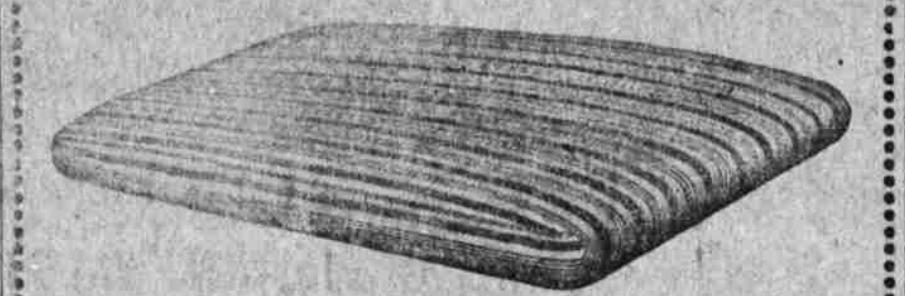
