NO COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL IN UMATILLA

The west end of Umatilla county will not get its union high school, for the present at least, says the Pendleton M. O. Because the petitions presented to the district boundary board were defective, that body refused to issue the orders instructing the district interests to vote upon the proposition at the annual school meeting this month.

In order to prevent a failure, the Echo petitioners had connected their district with each of the four others affected (intending to use the Echo vote to carry the proposition in each of the others. As District Attorney Phelps, Attorney General Crawford and State School Superintendent Ackerman all declared the petitions irregular, the board refused to issue the order for the election.
