SPECIAL ELECTION NOTICE.

Tuesday, June 22, 1909.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that on 22 day of June, A. D. 1909, a special election will be held in the city of La Grande, in the County of Union and State of Oregon, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters thereof, the proposition of adopting or rejecting an act entitled: "An act to provide a revised and consolidated charter of the City of La Grande, in the County of Union, in the State of Oregon," filed in the office of the City Recorder of said City on the 21st day of April, A. D. 1909, and ordained by the city council of said city by Ordinance No. 418 Series 1909, entitled:

"An ordinance ordaining a revised and consolidated charter of the City of La Grande, Oregon, and submitting the same to the legal voters of said city for adoption or rejection at a special election to be held therein on June 22, A. D. 1909," duly passed by the council of said city at a regular meeting thereof on the 21st day of April, A. D. 1909.

The polling places designated for said election and the judges and clerks appointed to conduct said elections are as follows:

FIRST WARD--polling place at Court House.

SECOND WARD--polling place at Council Chambers.

THIRD WARD--polling place at Ramsey Building on Pennsylvania avenue.

Judges--M. A. Harrison, John Cates, J. M. Hiltz. Clerk--C. R. Thornton, Chester Hamilton.

FOURTH WARD--polling place at Harris Hall.

Judges--Bernard Logsdon, Win. Thompson, G. E. Fowler. Clerk--J. M. Kochensparger, J. T. Williamson.

Said election will be held and conducted and the returns thereof filed as provided by law in the case of general city election in said city.

The polls at said election will be opened at the hour of 9 o'clock A. M. and closed at the hour of 5 o'clock P. M. on said election day.

The ballot title of the act aforesaid will be prepared by the city attorney and filed with the city recorder of said city, in the manner and time required by the laws of the State of Oregon governing the initiative and referendum in cities and as in the Ordinance aforesaid provided.

ARRANGING FOR OUR NEXT FAIR

J. D. McKennon, C. D. Huffman and F. E. Smith, appointed by the county court as fair commissioners, met this morning and elected officers for the coming year. J. D. McKennon will be president; F. L. Meyers, treasurer, and Fred M. Huffman, secretary. We are to have a real fair this fall, and if the Commercial club and the merchants can arrange to take care of the stock the event will be held in the streets of La Grande. This matter will come up at Monday night's meeting of the club board of managers, and will very likely be decided. It is understood that the fair association has made a proposition to the club.

The last legislature amended the act providing funds for holding a fair in this district, consisting of Union and Walla walla counties, and instead of \$1,500, there will be available \$2,000. Of this amount Walla walla county will get \$750 and Union \$1,250. If Walla walla county should hold no fair, Union county commissioners may disburse the entire amount. This is money enough to provide for adequate and attractive premiums, and if the arrangements in regard to stock can be made, the fair next fall will be the most enjoyable event of the kind ever held in the county.
