## ECCLES WILL EXTEND ROAD

David Eccles, the railroad and sugar magnate, passed through the city this morning en route to Baker City where he will hold a conference with prominent citizens of Baker and Grant counties about the extension of the Sumpter Valley into Prarie City. Mr. Eccles says that Grant county has offered a bonus for the construction of the line from Austin to Prarie, a distance of 22 miles, and that in all probability it will be built, but it is very unlikely that the road will ever be extended farther. The construction of the proposed Central Oregon would destroy any object in a further extension of the Sumpter road. That there is a great field for railroad building in Central Oregon Mr. Eccles is well aware. He passed through Canyon City in 1868, and has watched the development of the country closely through many years. He also made a trip through the Grande Ronde in 1877.
