### HORSE KILLED: RIDER HURT

VALUABLE HORSE BROKE NECK AT RACE TRACK

Frank Halley Hurt by Fall-Animal a Valuable One-Died Instantly

A valuable horse owned by J. P. Halley, was instantly killed and Frank Halley, son of the owner, was seriously hurt in an accident which occurred at the race track yesterday morning. The horse broke its neck, dying almost instantly.

Frank had been riding the animal in training for races to be pulled off during the Fourth of July celebration. and was proceeding at a somewhat rapid gait through the weeds that have overgrown the track, when the animal stumbled. Just how the horse struck the ground is not known, but it was in such a way that the saddle horn caught Mr. Halley over the collar bone breaking that part of his anatomy. A nervous spasm or two. was the only action of the horse after the fall. Frank was taken to the city and given medical attention. He is able to walk around today, but suffers considerable pain.

The animal was a four-year-old mare, valued at \$250.00.
