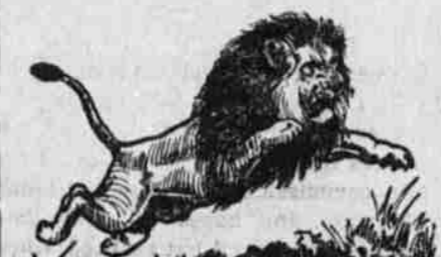
More Reclamation Works.

Through some work that is being done by the reclamation service in the vicinity of the mouth of Butter Creek rumors have become rife that the government is intending to take up an irrigation project on the west side of the Umatilla and covering a large section of the now desert land of Umatilla and Morrow counties.

For a number of weeks past a crew of men under Mr. Copeland, one of the reclamation engineers, has been at work on the test pits near the mouth of Butter Creek. These pits are being sunk for the purpose of ascertaining the water retaining powers of the land in that locality. Though no information has been given out by the reclamation men it is generally believed by parties familiar with the locality that the land is such that it may be used for reservoir purposes.—Pendleton E. O.
