J. J. Clancy of this city has presented the lowest bid for the construction of the county poor farm hospital to be built on the new poor farm. The bids were opened this afternoon before County Judge Henry and the county commissioners, but none of the bidders were present to sign contracts, hence, in technical terms, no bid had been awarded, late today.

The list of bids presented, follows: J. J. Clancy, \$1,622.55; Helsen and Robinson, \$1800; Contractor Wagner, \$1900; and C. D. Goodnough, \$2070.
