CODLIN MOTH WAR ENDS IN VICTORY FOR ORCHARDISTS

Orchardists are coping with Codlin moth in a very creditable manner, and the threatening epidemic of a few weeks ago has been relieved to a great extent. Prompt attention to the moth, on suggestions of the county Fruit Inspector, Garrit Oldenberg, and on their own initiative, avoided subsequent damage to the fruit.
Fear blight is now holding attention and will need care and effort similar to the war which stayed the

spread of Codlin moth.
The pear crop this year is light, but the quality is excellent, and unless blight ruins a portion of the crop, growers will not lose on their pear orchards this year by any means.
