LOCAL MAN ORIGINATES OVATION IN METHODISM.

Seattle Gathering First of Its Kind But is Permanent.

There met in the city of Seattle last week the first meeting of the sort in this region or any other one of Methodism. It was a "brain storm" of a La Grande man, and proved to be an unqualified success. All Methodism is divided into districts. There are fifteen of them, and you, Mr. Editor, assisted in the forming of the last and newest, the fifteenth. This territory occupies the following bit of American soil: Wyoming, Idaho, Oregon, Montana, Washington and Alaska, together with these choice bits of foreign lands, Bengal, Bombay, Malaysia, North India, Philippines, and South India conferences.

The idea was primarily to have representatives of the various portions of the American continent present the facts as to the various possibilities of the states embodied, and to show the work that is being done by and thru the many agencies of the widely spread denomination.

The projector receiving the most hearty cooperation of the men and women working here was able to see the plans carried out exactly as prearranged and programmed. By different men there were presented the following subjects: Foreigners of the Northwest; Cities of the Northwest; Strategic points of the Northwest; Alaska as a Mission Field, Wyoming as a Mission Field, Economic Demands of this region for strategic campaigning, Pacific Coast Japanese, etc., while the women and the deaconesses spoke on the work they can and are doing for the needy among our cities and neglected places. The world is bigger with real good when we hear the toilers tell of their successes then we would thing, each of us seeing but the littles and few of them sometimes.

Added to this was the report of each of the twenty-three district superintendents of the American part. Afterward, as a special desert Dr. Rader,

President Tenny, and others told the congress what to expect of the resident agencies of the Northwest, such as The Christian Advocate, the universities, the hospitals, etc.  
The meeting was well attended and another was planned for.

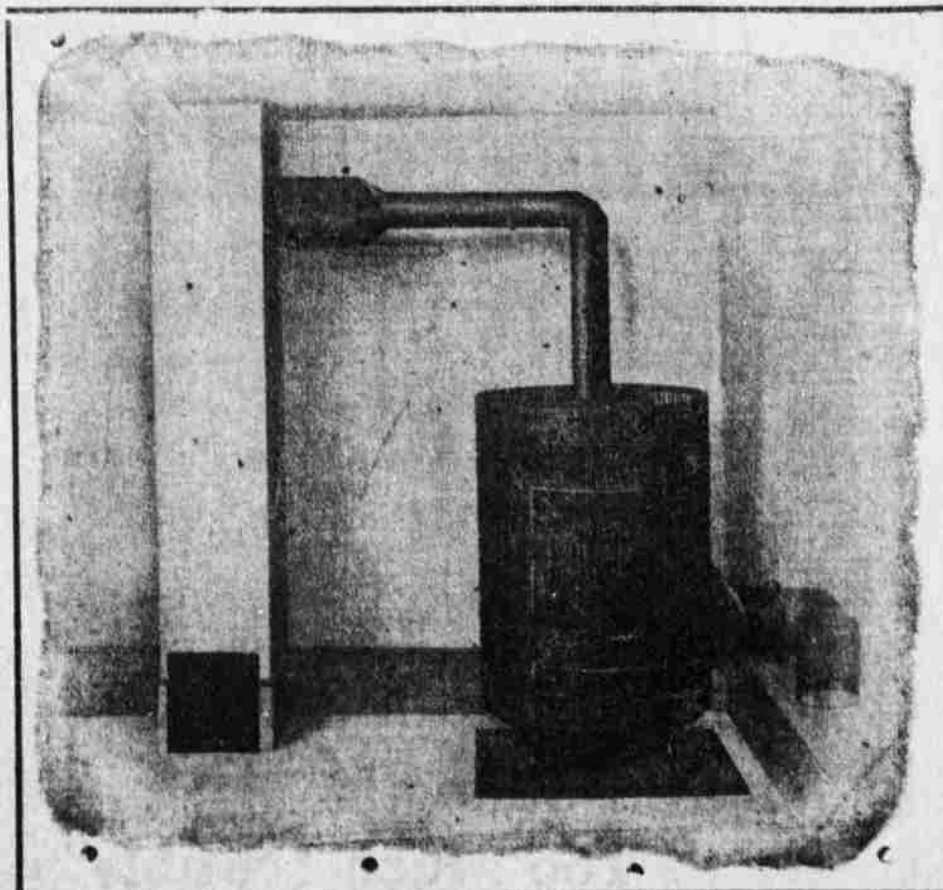
