THIRTEEN FROM HERE

FIRST ELK RETURNS FROM THE BIG CONCLAVE.

PROCLAMATION.

I, M. K. Hall, mayor of the City of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, hereby certify and proclaim:

That a certain act, entitled: "An act to provide a revised and consolidated charter of the City of La Grande, in the County of Union, in the State of Oregon," filed in the office of the City Recorder of said city on April 21, A. D. 1909, and ordained by the city council of said city by ordinance No. 418, Series 1909, entitled: "An Ordinance ordaining a revised and consolidated charter of the city of La Grande, Oregon, and submitting the same to the legal voters of said city for adoption or rejection at a special election to be held therein on June 22, A. D. 1909," duly passed by the city council of said city at a regular meeting thereof on the 21st day of April, A. D. 1909, which was submitted to the legal voters of said city for rejection or adoption at a special election called and held therein on June 22, A. D. 1909, received an affirmative majority of all the votes cast at said election—there being 293 votes in favor of the adoption of said act, and 37 votes against the adoption of said act.

Wherefore, I, Mayor as aforesaid, hereby give public proclamation and notice that said act has been duly accepted in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Oregon, and that said revised and consolidated charter of the said City of La Grande is now in full force and effect.

Done at the City of La Grande, Oregon, this 22nd day of July, A. D. 1909.
