Prominent Lumbermen Visit Holdings Here—Predict Great Future.

Nibley of Salt Lake City, president of the Nibley-Minnaugh Lumber Company, and the Grande Ronde Lumber Company, vice-president of the Oregon Lumber Company, and prominently connected with many other lumbering and railroad companies, C. W. Nibley Jr. of La Grande, manager of the Meacham Lumber Company, and George Stoddard, president of Stoddard Brothers Lumber Company of Baker City, vice-president and general manager of the Grande Ronde Lumber Company, and a heavy stockholder in the Nibley-Minnaugh Lumber Company of this city, were in Wallowa Tuesday and Wednesday on a visit to the company here and to look over the progress on the new mill.
