**YOUNG WILL WITH JUDGE**

**END IN SIGHT OVER LONG WILL FIGHT.**

Pendleton Attorneys Waive Oratorical Features.  
The fate of the famous so-called "fourth" will to the James W. Young estate, is now in the hands of Judge Gilliland, according to the Pendleton E. O.

When 9 o'clock, the time appointed for beginning the arguments, arrived this morning, the attorneys for both sides waived argument and the case was submitted without the two days of oratory that had been expected. Judge Gilliland is now going over the documents introduced as evidence, in order to make up his mind a little more clear on some few points. He says he will be prepared to give his decision in four or five days, which will make it about next Monday or Tuesday.  
It is generally conceded, however, that the decision of the county court will not be accepted as final by either side and that the case is sure to be carried to the circuit court and from there to the supreme court. Judge Gilliland's decision will mark the close of another round in the battle.
