## 15,000 MOORS ARE ON FIRING LINE

## ALPHONSO FOLLOWERS PICKED

## DON CARLOS' SON ADVANCED AS PRETENDER.

## SPANISH TROOPS ARE BESTED OFTEN

Situation in Spain's War Seat Extremely Critical.

LISBON, Portugal, August 3.—(Bulletin)—Fifteen thousand Moors are attacking Spanish troops entrapped in and around Melilla today, according to messages received here. The native population, heretofore unparticipating in the war, is now reported to be revolting. From reports of refugees who ran the besieging lines, the Spanish garrisons at Melilla are doomed. Coast ports report that the uprising is spreading throughout Morocco.

**Barcelona Death List 2,000.**  
BIARRITZ, August 3.—Regular train service from Barcelona was resumed today. Trains bearing the wounded refugees from the revolt ridden province of Catalonia are arriving today. Passengers from Barcelona say that the government troops are engaged in fortifying their position in anticipation of another outbreak.

Revolutionist who were driven from the city in the recent outbreaks are refuging in the mountain adjacent, and it is believed that they are preparing for another attack upon the loyalists.

Barcelona is now in the possession of the loyal troops. Allowing the exaggerated tales of the terrified refugees, 2,000 were killed.

### Don Carlos' Son Pretending.

CERBER, France, August 3.—Troops sent from Barcelona to destroy refugees in mountain seclusions were repulsed with heavy losses according to messages here today. The situation is considered serious.

Followers of the late Don Carlos, pretender to the throne of Spain, are advancing the cause of his son, Don Jaiuos, but little chance exists for his gaining the crown if Alphonso loses the throne, as it is probable that a republic will be formed. Don Jaiuos is a military leader and may possibly take the field.

## JOHNSON'S LAWS

### JEFFRIES TO SAIL FOR EUROPE ANYWAY.

Will Not Stay to Meet Johnson as Later Demands.

NEW YORK, August 3.—J. J. Jeffries announced today he would sail for Europe next Thursday regardless of Johnson's demand that he remain in America.

Johnson in posting \$5,000 forfeit yesterday at Chicago, announced the only condition that he would insist on, was that Jeffries remain in this country and attend to fight matters. Jeffries said he had made all arrangements for his European trip and that Sam Berger would remain and meet Johnson's representative.

## City Safe Balks.

Ellensburg, Aug. 3.—Efforts being made today to open the safe where all of the important city documents are locked up, are unavailing. The combination refuses to work, municipal business is at a standstill. The city council was unable to transact monthly business at the meeting last night. Payroll department bills are locked up and the effort to open the safe was unsuccessful.

## EYEWITNESS TO BIG WRECK

## J. C. GULLING WAS ON ONE TRAIN

### SCENES EXTREMELY HORRIBLE

## HIS OWN ESCAPE WAS CLOSE AND DANGEROUS.

### HAS NOT SEEN LOCAL VICTIMS

Wreck Worst Coming to His Knowledge of Railroad.

Conductor J. C. Gulling of this city has returned from Spokane, and that he is alive is due largely to good fortune which camped on his trail during the horrible wreck at La Crosse, near Coeur d'Alene last Saturday evening. Mr. Gulling was riding in the street car train, and well up in front of the car which jammed into the motor train and by which 15 were killed and scores wounded. His family and friends here were not aware that Mr. Gulling was in the Coeur d'Alene region at the time of the wreck, and have been at peace with their minds during the interim.

In company with an old-time friend from Spokane Mr. Gulling was going out to the lakes on a street car train made up of new equipment. At the time of the crash, the two were sitting near the forward end of the car and the impact was sufficient to throw Mr. Gulling over the seat at his front, and into the aisle. When he had righted himself and reached the open, what he describes as the most horrible sight coming to his vision during his long term of service in railroad work, greeted his eyes. Fortunate for him, the greatest damage was done to the motor car, composed of poorer equipment.

**Gruesome Scenes Indeed.**  
Some of the incidents related by Mr. Gulling are truly awfully. He stated today, that in passing the debris after the wreck, streams of human blood as large as small garden hose would be seen oozing out of the cracks in the wreckage. One woman in the same car with Mr. Gulling, was struck in the chest by a splinter. The board was about five inches wide, and penetrated the body directly over the heart. It did not stop in its death course until protruding a distance of several inches out of the back.

**Morgue-Like Silence.**  
Contrary to general opinions, there were but few "scenes." As soon as the first crash was over, a pall of silence fell on the living and those who escaped uninjured. Employees of a mill nearby had rushed to the scene and rescue work progressed for considerable time very quietly and in morgue-like silence. The survivors were too horrified to speak.

Mr. Gulling was not aware that Ed Thomas was on either of the trains, and learned the fact only after reading the papers. He did not, either,

see the Elgin men hurt in the wreck.

### MISS ROBERTS TO MARRY.

## UNVEILED TODAY

### TRIBUTE TO RAILROAD MAN IS INTERNATIONAL.

Bitter Feelings Between Governor And Childberg.

### Bitter Feeling Yesterday.

SEATTLE, Aug. 2.—The failure of John A. Johnston, of Minnesota, to arrive in Seattle in time to deliver the address on Swedish day, at the exposition which, according to President J. E. Childberg, of the fair, he promised to do, caused a controversy and bitter feelings to arise between the Governor and the fair officials. "If the time ever comes when Johnston wishes to become a candidate for president, he could have saved himself many votes by sending a telegram of regrets for his inability to attend. I don't believe that he could get any votes from those he has disappointed," said Childberg. "Haven't broken any promises," said Johnston. ## DARK TURN FOR HARRY THAW

### WITNESS BREAKS DOWN IN CROSS EXAMINATION.

### AMOS BAKER THINKS THAW CRAZY

Justice Mills Upholds Decision of Examination.

WHITE PLAINS, N.Y., August 3.—The examination of Harry Thaw's sanity was opened by Justice Mills today. The judge questioned Dr. Amos Baker regarding Harry's confinement in Matteawan as to a number of questions Baker Thaw was insane without and that Harry's liberty would be a menace to the community. Afterwards on cross examination Baker admitted Thaw's signs of paranoia shown first three months in the institution. Thaw was recalled, questioned by Jerome. During examination Justice Mills said he was convinced the present hearing was more drastic for the prisoner, than any expert examination could have been.
